## “Missionary report ”

April 2016

### “Looking back over my shoulder”

In Nov. 2008 I came to Thailand to do three things:

1. Build a Children Home for orphans and disadvantaged children. This we have done and are still doing.
2. Secondly to start and establish an independent Baptist Church in Chiang Mai. (Trinity Baptist Church of Chiang Mai, Thailand. This we have done, and are still building it.
3. To win souls to Christ & Baptize them into the church. This we have done and are doing. Our God has been gracious to us and to Him be all the Glory. We intend to continue all three of these goals. As long as the Lord permits. There is still much work to do in Chiang Mai which is almost entirely Buddhist.

Much of the credit should go to my wife Nala, who has truly been a help mate to me in the Mission work. She graduated from a college in Chiang Mai with her Diploma in accounting, then worked for a Missionary firm as an accountant for 24 years until she married me. She teaches children in Sunday school, helps in the Children’s Home, and does all the record keeping.

This week I received an e-mail from a Missionary who asked me to help a group of Burmese people who want to start a Church. I agreed to meet with them and to see if I could help them.

Also for the past several weeks we have had a retired army lieutenant colonel visiting our services and seems quite interested in the word of God. Please pray for Nawin who is a Thai and he is also President of the Lisu Cultural Association in Chiang Mai. He could be very helpful in helping us contact the Lisu people. The Lisu Hill-Tribe is one of 6 different Tribes living in the Jungles & Villages of Thailand.

Thank you so much to the churches and folks who have so loyally helped us with this work (which would not have been done without your prayers and faithful support.)
