I am also receiving word that many of the lay pastors and church members in the more remote areas are suffering from hunger and malnutrition because of the severe drought in Malawi and Mozambique as you can see in the picture of the corn field that should be 6 to 7 feet tall.

The shortage in the monthly support is hindering the pastor/missionaries from traveling to some of the churches to hold revivals, evangelism meetings, and train the lay pastors. However, they are sacrificing that they might go and minister to those who ask them to come. I am very pleased to receive reports telling that even though the churches are struggling they are willing to sacrifice in order to help other churches and brethren that are in need.

The pioneer missionary Robert Moffat said, "Many a morning have I stood on the porch of my house, and looking northward, have seen the smoke arise from villages that have never heard of Jesus Christ. I have seen, at different times, the smoke of a thousand villages—villages whose people are without Christ, without God, and without hope in the world ... The smoke of a thousand villages ... The smoke of a thousand villages." The same is true today! These men are never without places to go and preach the Gospel. They are willing and ready; all they lack are the financial means to go.
