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We were saddened this past week to lose a good friend-Brother Gordon Downs who passed away in his home. He was 81 years of age, I was with him at his home when he passed on.

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Greetings from Chiang Mai, Thailand.

Nala and I are well physically, but we are serving in a spiritually hostile environment. Satan has a strangle hold on the people of Thailand. We are confronted with his opposition almost daily as we witness and preach the Gospel of Gods Saving Grace. The Lord is still conquering some in these areas. We are seeing some former victims in church attendance and some new people showing an interest in the Gospel. We are also witnessing to some Korean people who live here in Chiang Mai. Some come and tell others about our church, what we preaching and they in turn have told others.

We have no newspaper here in Chiang Mai, but word of mouth is still the best method of getting our message out . Our support is holding steady for the work, However the support for the Children's Home is down somewhat. The Children's Home requires 2,000.00 per month and we presently receive about 1,600.00 per month for it.

A sad scene we witness almost every week is to see a motorcycle lying broken in the street with it 's rider lying dead beside it. I understand it is the only cheap method of transportation they can afford but it takes a terrible toll on human life. According to the Bangkok Post over 24,000 have been killed already this year. That is 66 deaths every day!, from Motorcycle accidents!

The Thai people believe in Buddhism and cremate their dead, and I have never seen a mortuary here. They have no hope of a Resurrection and many believe in Reincarnation, hoping they might return as a dog or a cat in another life. We preach a lot about the bodily Resurrection but except those who have been saved and are in our church, they are utterly hopeless. We are here to give them hope in Christ but many show no interest. Thailand is pretty much a forgotten mission field.

The Lord encourages us now & then with new visitors as our church is growing, we have been in Chiang Mai 10 years now and have never taken a vacation or a furlough since we arrived.

We are very thankful to the churches & individuals who understand and faithfully support us even though we can only keep you a breast with our Missionary letter. Our Sunday morning services are Broadcast on our website every week and on U-Tube. This is one way you can visually see what we are doing and what we preaching. The official religion of Thailand is Buddhism. The people of Thailand have made Buddha a god, although he never claimed to be God, thus they are worshiping a fictitious god. When we preach to them, it is to bear down on reality, and point them to a real God. The problem is that that they are very polite people and it is very easy to get a profession of faith from them because they do not want to offend anyone, however once they are out of sight they drop everything they professed. Buddha taught “ Enlightenment ” but he knew nothing about the Gospel however there are some who hear the Gospel and are truly Enlightened by the Holy Spirit.
